Cincinnati (Dec. 11, 2009) Hamilton County residents who are thinking about foster care or adoption can learn more Dec. 14 at an event hosted by the Hamilton County Department of Job and Family Services to help celebrate National Adoption Month.

The information session will be held at 6 p.m. at the Job and Family Services Department's office, 222 E. Central Parkway. Recruiters and others will discuss the licensing, or certification, process, the children available for adoption or foster care and support available to those who choose to become foster or adoptive families. "Someone thinking about becoming a foster or adoptive parent may have just a few questions they want answered to help them make the decision," said Moira Weir, director of the department. "This event is geared towards those people, allowing them to stop by after work and get their questions answered quickly or stay longer to learn as much as they want about the joys of being a foster or adoptive parent."

The county has about 850 children in foster care each day. It currently has about 230 foster care families working directly with the Department of Job and Family Services. The department also has about 250 children available for adoption.
