HAMILTON COUNTY JOBS AND FAMILY SERVICES CAMP PROGRAMS

Youth Camp (ages 7-12) • June 16-20

A one-week residential camp that provides youth with an opportunity to choose their activities such as canoeing, sports and games, fishing, archery, nature, biking, crafts, and drama. Campers also participate in adventure ropes courses, swimming, and evening activities such as campfires, group games, and dances.

Teen Camp (ages 13-15) • June 16-20

This program serves approximately 25 teens in a rustic river village cabin setting away from main camp. Teens participate in traditional camp activities such as swimming, crafts, canoeing, archery, and nature. Teens also participate in teambuilding challenge courses, leadership adventure courses such as high ropes, bike trips, canoe trips, hiking, and opportunities to cook over an open flame.

Core Camp (ages 12-16) • July 7-11

This camp serves as a leadership development seminar and training for a year-long commitment as a Core Camper. Core Campers will meet monthly in Cincinnati to develop programs for camp and to perform community service. This camp is by application and interview process and is limited to 40 campers.

Leader-in-Training (LIT) (ages 15-16) • July 16-25

The LIT program is designed for youth who are interested in developing leadership skills. During an intense 10-day experience, LITs develop leadership skills through community service projects, off-site trips, high ropes courses, and experiences working with younger campers. LITs stay in primitive shelters and cook some of their own meals over a camp fire. *This program is limited to 15 campers.*

Camp Reunite (ages 7-16) • July 28-August 1

This camp program is designed to bring biological siblings separated in different placements together for a sibling camp. The program includes family activities, crafts, adventure, talent shows, games, teambuilding, canoeing, nature and more.
