Funder: Office of National Drug Control Policy/SAMHSA

Award Range: Up to \$100,000

Summary: The grant supports community coalitions that mobilize their communities to prevent youth alcohol, tobacco, illicit drug, and inhalant abuse. Coalitions may consist of youth; parents; media; law enforcement; school officials; faith-based organizations; fraternal organizations; State, local, and tribal government agencies; healthcare professionals; and other community representatives. The Drug-Free Communities Support Program enables the coalitions to strengthen their coordination and prevention efforts, encourage citizen participation in substance abuse reduction efforts, and disseminate information about effective programs.

Grant Name: INTERVENTION RESEARCH TO IMPROVE YOUTH-SERVING ORGANIZATIONS

Funder: William T. Grant Foundation

Award Range: \$250,000 to \$1,500,000 for the two-to-four-year duration of the project, including direct and indirect costs.

Summary: Supports intervention research to improve youth-serving organizations, such as schools and community-based organizations, or their subunits, such as classrooms and after-school program sites. Consistent with our mission, we are interested in organizations that seek to improve the lives of youth ages 8 to 25. We conceptualize these organizations and their subunits as "social settings": proximal contexts for youth's experiences. Improving these social settings entails intervening to alter important aspects of the social setting, including the social processes, resources, and/or social, spatial, and structural arrangements within settings. Examples of these aspects of settings include, but are not limited to, physical arrangements of organizational space; social norms regarding aggression in classrooms; the quality, content, and structure of interactions between youth and adults in youth programs; and the availability of significant and meaningful roles for youth within schools and community-based organizations.
