Grant Name: Family to Family Health Information and Education Centers, CFDA # 93.110.(also called "Integrated Services for Children with Special

Health Care Needs").

Eligibility: Any public or private entity, faith based and community based organization are eligible to apply for this federal funding opportunity that can document previous experience to address review criteria in guidance.

Funder: US Dept. of HHS, Health Resources and Services Administration

Award Range/Funding Period: Approximately up to \$100,000 each, per year, for three years, subject to availability of funds. Project period: June 1, 2007–May 31, 2010.

Summary: Reduce barriers to community living for people with disabilities and to address families' lack of access to the services, advocacy and assistance they need as mandated in The Family Opportunity Act of 2005. Grants will fund state-based, family-run centers providing technical assistance and peer support to families of children with special health care needs. They will be responsible for developing partnerships with those organizations serving these children and their families and monitor the progress of programs with responsibility for payment and direct services of this population through a statewide data collection system.

Grant Name: Prisoner Reentry Initiative (PRI), CFDA # 16.202
Eligibility: State government agencies, including state Departments of Corrections and State Criminal Justice Administering Agencies, and federally recognized Indian tribes.
Funder: US Dept. of Justice/OJP/BJA
Award Range/Funding Period: Up to \$450,000, 24-35 mos., 25%

match required.

Summary: PRI is designed to reduce recidivism by helping returning offenders find work and access other critical services in their communities. The Bureau of Justice Assistance (BJA) will award grants to state agencies to provide pre-release assessment, programming and services, transition planning, and post-release supervision and coordination of services for offenders returning to communities.

SMALLER GRANTS

Grant Name: NASCC Martin Luther King Day of Service Grants

Eligibility: No organizational restrictions specified

Funder: National Association of Service and Conservation Corps

Award Range/Funding Period: \$1,000 – 5,000, 70% non-federal match required.

Summary: NASCC will fund organizations that mobilize volunteers, especially disadvantaged youth, to undertake service activities to benefit impoverished communities. A service project must do one of the following: 1) Provide relief to a condition of poverty through a service project; 2) Mobilize a diverse group of volunteers with an emphasis on disadvantaged youth; 3) Develop new and existing partnerships with community organizations who will participate in the project; 4) Provide educational and recruitment materials to project volunteers and the community at large.

Grant Name: Allstate Education & Job Training Fund

Eligibility: Any survivor of domestic violence is eligible to apply; however, we are requesting that the application be completed by a local Domestic Violence Program or a Domestic Violence Coalition to be accepted.

Funder: Allstate Foundation/National Network to End Domestic

Violence

Award Range/Funding Period: Up to \$1,000, limit of two grants per calendar year.

Summary: The grant will fund licensing fees (nursing, social work, etc), books and supplies for school, job skills training (e.g., resume building, interview preparation, clothing), tuition,

requirements for jobs (e.g., uniforms, tools), registration fees, temporary child care so that the applicant can attend school, take a class, or look for employment, public transportation, rental fees for computer time at a computer center

Grant Name: Teammates for Kids Foundation

Eligibility: Be a 501 (c) (3) tax-exempt nonprofit organization in good standing with the Internal Revenue Service;

- Have a record of outstanding service in effectively and efficiently delivering programs and services that improve

the lives of needy children;

- Serve children's needs in the areas of Health, Education or providing Inner-city services;
- Deliver services which impact the lives of children, both short and long-term;
- Ensure that 100% of grant monies received from the Teammates for Kids Foundation are used for the exclusive benefit of children.

Funder: Teammates for Kids Foundation

Award Range/Funding Period: \$10,000 – 50,000; no consecutive year grants.

Summary: Funding priorities are in health and education, particularly as applied to low-income inner-city children.

Due Date: Applications are only accepted between 12/01/06 and 2/1/07.

Grant Name: Student Achievement Grants

Eligibility: Applicants must be practicing U.S.

- public school teachers in grades PreK–12,
- public school education support professionals, or
- faculty or staff at public higher education institutions.

Preference will be given to applicants who serve economically disadvantaged students. Preference will also be given to members of the National Education Association. The NEA Foundation especially encourages grant applications from

- teachers with less than seven years of experience in the profession
- education support professionals

Funder: National Education Foundation

Award Range/Funding Period: \$5,000, 12 mos. from date of award

Summary: The proposed work should engage students in critical thinking and problem solving that deepen their knowledge of standards-based subject matter. The work should also improve students' habits of inquiry, self-directed learning, and critical reflection. Proposals for work resulting in low-income and minority student success with honors, advanced placement, or other challenging curricula are particularly encouraged.
