**Grant Name:** Enhanced Training and Services to End Violence Against and Abuse of Women Later in Life Program, CFDA # 16.528.

**Funder:** US DOJ/OVW

**Eligibility:** States; units of local government; and nonprofit, nongovernmental victim services organizations with demonstrated experience in assisting elderly women or demonstrated experience in addressing domestic violence, dating violence, sexual assault, and stalking, including faith- and community-based organizations.

**Award Range/Funding Period:** For new projects, \$500,000 over a 36 month project period.

**Summary:** Recognizing that individuals who are 50 years of age or older who are victims of elder abuse, neglect, and exploitation, including domestic violence, dating violence, sexual assault, or stalking, face unique barriers to receiving assistance, Congress created the Enhanced Training and Services to End Violence Against and Abuse of Women Later in Life Program (Training Grants Program.) In Federal Fiscal Year 2008, OVW plans to fund projects that will provide a comprehensive approach to addressing elder abuse in their communities. This comprehensive approach will encompass providing training to criminal justice professionals, governmental agencies and victim assistants to enhance their ability to address elder abuse, neglect and exploitation in their communities; providing cross training opportunities to professionals working with older victims; developing or enhancing a community coordinated responses to elder abuse; and providing or enhancing services for victims who are 50 years of age or older.

**Grant Name:** Youth Violence Prevention through Community-Level Change, CFDA # 93.136

**Funder:** US Dept of HHS/CDC

**Eligibility:** Public nonprofit organizations; private nonprofit organizations; for profit organizations; small, minority, and women-owned businesses; universities; colleges; research institutions; hospitals; community-based organizations; faith-based organizations; state and local governments or their Bona Fide Agents.

**Award Range/Funding Period:** There will be two annual awards of up to \$500,000 each, for project periods of up to 5 years.

**Summary:** The purpose of the program is to assess the efficacy or effectiveness of interventions designed to change community characteristics and social processes to reduce rates of youth violence perpetration and victimization. Youth violence has been linked to a variety of factors, including individual, family, community, and societal characteristics. Although much research has been conducted on interventions to change the characteristics of individuals and families, fewer interventions have focused on changing variables at the broader community level. Funds are available to examine the effects of a community-level intervention on rates of youth violence. Funds are intended to support new evaluations rather than to supplement or support long-term extensions of existing effectiveness studies of community-level interventions. This program addresses the "Healthy People 2010" focus area(s) of Injury and Violence Prevention.

**Grant Name:** Basic Center Program, CFDA # 93.623

**Funder:** US Dept of HHS/ACF

**Eligibility:** State governments, county governments, local governments, city or township governments, regional organizations, public/indian housing authorities, non-profits with 501(c)(3) IRS status (other than institutions of higher education), non-profits without 501(c)(3) IRS status (other than institutions of higher education), faith-based and community-based organizations.

**Award Range/Funding Period:** \$200,000 maximum award per budget period, for 36-month projects (3 budget periods). Ohio has \$1,272,738 budgeted for continuation projects and \$370,353 for new projects. Kentucky has \$573,455 for continuation projects and \$27,890 for new projects.

**Summary:** The purpose of this grant is to establish proposed or strengthen existing community-based BCPs that provide temporary emergency shelter and care to runaway and homeless youth. BCPs provide shelter and support services that assist youth in crisis, reunite youth with their families (as appropriate), strengthen family relationships, and help youth transition to safe and appropriate alternative living arrangements where they can become

independent, self-sufficient, contributing members of society. Funds granted under this award may be used to establish, to renovate (not to exceed 15 percent of the grant award) and/or to operate local BCPs that provide services for RHY and their families outside of law enforcement and the child welfare, mental health, and juvenile justice systems.

**Grant Name:** Community Action for a Renewed Environment (CARE) Program, CFDA # 66.035

**Funder:** US EPA

**Eligibility:** Local, public non-profit institution/organizations, private non-profit institutions/organizations, quasi-public nonprofit institutions/organizations both interstate and intrastate, local government, colleges, and universities.

**Award Range/Funding Period:** EPA anticipates awarding 5 – 10 Level I cooperative agreements ranging in approximate value from \$75,000 to \$100,000. Most Level I agreements are expected to be funded at the level of about \$90,000 with a maximum value of \$100,000. EPA also anticipates awarding 6 – 8 Level II cooperative agreements ranging in approximate value from \$150,000 to \$300,000. Most Level II agreements are expected to be funded at about \$275,000 with a maximum value of \$300,000. Funding periods are 24 months.

**Summary:** CARE is a unique community-based, community-driven, multimedia demonstration program designed to help communities understand and reduce risks due to toxics and environmental pollutants from all sources. The CARE grant program works with the eligible entities to help their communities form collaborative partnerships, develop a comprehensive understanding of the many sources of risk from toxics and environmental pollutants, set priorities, and identify and carry out projects to reduce risks through collaborative action at the local level. CARE's long-term goal is to help communities build self-sustaining, community-based partnerships that will continue to improve human health and local environments into the future. **EPA will award two types of cooperative agreements (Level I and Level II) under this solicitation as part of the CARE grant program.** . Level I cooperative agreements will support the following types of activities: working with the funded entity to form community-based collaborative partnerships; developing a comprehensive understanding of the many sources of risk from toxics and environmental pollutants; and setting community risk reduction priorities. . Level II cooperative agreements will fund activities to identify and demonstrate actual risk reduction projects “on the ground” in their community. Level II agreements are for communities that have already completed the actions typically taken in a Level I agreement. However, receipt of a Level I cooperative agreement is not a prerequisite to receiving a Level II cooperative agreement.

**Grant Name:** Homeownership Grant Program

**Funder:** Wells Fargo Housing Foundation

**Eligibility:** Government entities or 501(c) (3)s who serve low-to-moderate income homebuyers.

**Award Range/Funding Period:** No limit is set for awards, but the Foundation cites an average of \$7,000 for one-year grants.

**Summary:** Wells Fargo provides financial resources to local nonprofit housing organizations to create sustainable homeownership opportunities for low-to moderate-income people. Areas of interest are: **Construction/Rehab**, for the development and pre-development of construction or rehab of owner-occupied homes; **Education, counseling and prevention**, for homebuyer education, pre-and post-purchase counseling and foreclosure prevention; **Subsidies**, for down payment and closing cost subsidies, interest rate buy downs and other subsidies that assist homebuyers/ homeowners to purchase or retain their homes; **Home repairs**, for essential home repairs, purchases and modifications (e.g. repair or replacement of a furnace or to build a ramp for handicap accessibility).
