Grant Name: Alcohol Abuse Reduction Program, CFDA # 84.184A

Funder: US Dept of Education, Office of Safe and Drug-Free Schools

Eligibility: Local Educational Agencies (LEA's) who do not have an active grant under CFDA 84.184A.

Award Range/Funding Period: An estimated 20 awards will be granted at a range of \$200,000 - \$400,000, for 36 months.

Summary: This program provides grants to LEAs to develop and implement innovative and effective programs to reduce alcohol abuse in secondary schools.

Grant Name: Women in Apprenticeship and Nontraditional Occupations Program, CFDA # 17.201

Funder: US Dept of Labor, Employment & Training Administration

Eligibility: Only CBO/RAP ("Registered Apprenticeship Program") consortia may apply for and receive a grant

award. The CBO (“Community Based Organization”) may be faith-based (see Award Range)

Award Range/Funding Period: These are two-year grants totaling approximately \$300,000 each to up to three CBO/FBO/RAP consortia, each consisting of a minimum of one each of: (1) A construction industry RAP sponsor, and (2) a CBO (which may be faith based) with demonstrated experience in securing job training services from established training institutions such as community colleges, and providing placement and support services to women in construction industry jobs. The grants will be funded in increments of \$150,000 for each year. Funding for the second year will be contingent upon satisfactory progress toward grant requirements for placement of women in registered apprenticeship programs as discussed in Section V.

Summary: The purpose of this grant is to assist employers and labor unions in the placement and retention of women in apprenticeship and nontraditional occupations.

Grant Name: Parent Information and Training Program, CFDA # 84.235F

Funder: US Dept of Ed/Office of Special Education and Rehabilitative Services

Eligibility: Private nonprofit organizations that meet the requirements in section 303(c)(4) of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973, as amended (Act). (see Section III of the NOFA)

Award Range/Funding Period: An estimated 7 awards from \$95,000 - \$105,000, for project periods up to 60 months.

Summary: This program is designed to support projects that provide training and information to enable individuals with disabilities, and the parents, family members, guardians, advocates, or other authorized representatives of the individuals, to participate more effectively with professionals in meeting the vocational, independent living, and rehabilitation needs of individuals with disabilities. These grants are designed to meet the unique training and information needs of those individuals who live in the area to be served, particularly those who are members of populations that have been unserved or underserved by programs under the Act.

SAMHSA

Grant Name: Drug Free Communities Support Program, CFDA # 93.276

Funder: US Dept of HHS/SAMHSA

Eligibility: DFC grant funds are intended to support community-based coalitions. The eligibility requirements are extensive, see the website for details.

Award Range/Funding Period: \$60MM for approximately 60 new awards, for a period of 60 months.

Summary: DFC is a collaborative initiative sponsored by ONDCP (Office of National Drug Control Policy) in partnership with SAMHSA in order to achieve two major goals:

- Establish and strengthen collaboration among communities, private nonprofit agencies, and Federal, State, local, and tribal governments to support the efforts of community coalitions to prevent and reduce substance abuse among youth.
- Reduce substance abuse among youth and, over time, among adults by addressing the factors in a community that increase the risk of substance abuse and promoting the factors that minimize the risk of substance abuse. (Substances include, but are not limited to, narcotics, depressants, stimulants, hallucinogens, cannabis, inhalants, alcohol, and tobacco, where their use is prohibited by Federal, State, or local law.) *Note: DFC projects must focus on multiple drugs of abuse. When the term “drug” or “substance” is used in this funding announcement, it is intended to include all of the above drugs.*

Grant Name: CommUnity Impact Grants

Funder: The Home Depot Foundation

Eligibility: Non-profits

Award Range/Funding Period: Grant amounts vary up to \$3,000, funding period not specified.

Summary: Non-profits must engage volunteers to construct, refurbish and maintain play spaces (such as

playgrounds, parks, and trails); refurbish or maintain community gathering places (such as community centers); build, refurbish or maintain affordable or transitional housing; rebuild structures damaged in weather-related disasters.
