Grant Name: Strengthening Surveillance for Infectious Diseases Among Newly-Arrived Immigrants and Refugees, CFDA # 93.283

Funder: US Dept of HHS/CDC

Eligibility: Public nonprofit organizations, private nonprofit organizations, universities & colleges, research institutions, hospitals, community-based organizations, faith-based organizations.

Award Range/Funding Period: \$420,000 maximum/annual budget; project period is 5 years. No match required.

Summary: The purpose of the program is to assist health-care organizations in implementing a network of systems to detect, prevent and control communicable infectious diseases, including possible bioterrorism agents, among refugees and/or immigrants that are newly arrived in the United States. The program will accomplish this by doing the following: 1) establish and/or enhance existing surveillance networks for infectious diseases and diseases originating from bioterrorism agents. These illnesses may include, but are not limited to, the following syndromes: acute respiratory disease, febrile illness, febrile exanthemas, diarrheal illness, hepatitis, neurological conditions associated with infectious diseases, diseases originating from bioterrorism agents, and other diseases of public health significance among refugees and/or immigrants. Respiratory diseases may include seasonal influenza, highly pathogenic avian influenza, pandemic influenza and other infectious respiratory pathogens; 2) evaluate the health status of refugees and/or immigrants for the

purposes of informing and improving U.S. policy regarding overseas and the post-arrival health assessments; 3) prevent the importation and spread of infectious diseases and diseases originating from bioterrorism agents, including pathogens that cause febrile illness, febrile exanthemas, diarrheal illness, hepatitis, neurological conditions and acute respiratory illnesses, such as seasonal influenza, highly pathogenic avian influenza, and pandemic influenza; and 4) improve the health of refugees and/or immigrants undergoing U.S. resettlement and protect the health of their receiving communities by controlling the spread of communicable diseases and also disease in a naturally occurring pandemic or bioterrorism event.

Grant Name: Crime Victims' Rights Enforcement Project, CFDA # 16.747

Funder: US DOJ/Office for Victims of Crime (OVC)

Eligibility: Private nonprofit organizations, including faith-based and community-based organizations, colleges or universities, or public agencies that can demonstrate: (1) knowledge and understanding of enforcement of crime victims' rights, (2) experience in providing legal counsel and support services for victims in criminal cases, and (3) staff resources and capability to carry out all activities required by the funded project.

Award Range/Funding Period: Up to ten cooperative agreements will be awarded for up to \$200,000 each, with an award period of 12-18 months. Organizations proposing to provide sub-grants to several legal clinics may apply for an amount exceeding \$200,000.

Summary: This program will support clinics that provide legal counsel and support services for victims in criminal cases for the enforcement of crime victims' rights in federal, state and tribal jurisdictions; or organizations that provide training and technical assistance to such clinics. Organizations may use funding to provide legal representation to victims of crime in an effort to enforce victims' rights under the CVRA technical assistance, training and support to legal clinics that provide victim services and education and training on the CVRA.

Grant Name: FY2007 National Crime Victim Assistance Programs

Funder: US DOJ/OVC

Eligibility: Private nonprofit organizations, including faith-based and community-based organizations, that have a national scope that can demonstrate: (1) knowledge and understanding of needs of crime victims, (2) experience in the provision of victim services and advocacy, and (3)

staff resources and capability to carry out all activities required by the funded project.

Award Range/Funding Period: There will be two awards, at a value of up to \$600,000 each, for a period of 12 or 24 months.

Summary: The purpose of this solicitation is to provide support to programs that provide assistance to victims of crime nationwide and have the ability to direct victims to local victim service providers, law enforcement agencies and allied professionals, while helping victims rebuild their lives in the aftermath of a crime. OVC funds should be used to implement a program strategy and develop a sustainability plan for continuing project activities when the award period ends. OVC will offer funding to organizations that provide program activities in support of OVC's mission to enhance "the Nation's capacity to assist crime victims and to providing leadership in changing attitudes, policies, and practices to promote justice and healing for all victims of crime."

Grant Name: Back-to-School Grants

Funder: Dollar General

Eligibility: Elementary, middle and high schools within 20 miles of a Dollar General store.

Award Range/Funding Period: \$5,000 maximum.

Summary: This program intends to meet some of the financial challenges schools face in implementing new programs or purchasing new equipment, materials, or software for their school library or literacy program. Funds requested must be used to enhance or expand the school's library, media center, or literacy programs. Submissions will be judged based on creativity, statement of need, and use of funds.

Programs may address the needs of new readers, below-grade-level readers, readers with learning disabilities, or for general literacy.
