ADA

Grant Name: Strategic Alliance Grant Program
Funder: American Dental Association Foundation
Eligibility: Nonprofit or publicly-funded organizations.
Award Range/Funding Period: Up to \$100,000,

renewable for 1-2 years.

Summary: The ADA Foundation seeks to create a strategic alliance with other national or state-level organizations to mutually support one or more of the Foundation's mission areas: *dental research, education or access to care*. Proposals that include a project that can be implemented during a 2-3 year time period will be given priority. This multi-year approach will provide for and support ongoing collaboration and communication between the ADAF and the strategic alliance organization. The goal of this new initiative is to enhance the ADA Foundation's ability to expand its measurable impact.

Grant Name: Susan Harwood Training Grant Program, CFDA # 17.502

Funder: US Dept. of Labor/OSHA

Eligibility: Nonprofit organizations, including community and faith-based organizations, that are not an agency of State or local government, are eligible to apply. State and local government supported institutions of

higher education are also eligible to apply.

Award Range/Funding Period: Not specified.

Summary: The Susan Harwood Training Grant Program provides funds for programs to train employees and employers to recognize, avoid, and prevent safety and health hazards in their workplaces. The program emphasizes four areas: 1) Educating employees and employers in small businesses. For purposes of this grant program, a small business is one with 250 or fewer employees; 2) Training employees and employers about new OSHA standards; 3) Training at-risk employer and employee populations; 4) Training employees and employers about high risk activities or hazards identified by OSHA through the Department of Labor's Strategic Plan, or as part of an OSHA special emphasis program. Under this solicitation for grant applications, OSHA will accept applications for the Targeted Topic training grant category. Topics for the Targeted Topic Training Category Organizations funded for Targeted Topic training category grants are expected to develop and provide occupational safety and health training and/or educational programs addressing one of the topics selected by OSHA, recruit employees and employers for the training, and conduct and evaluate the training. Fourteen different training topics were selected for this grant announcement. OSHA may award grants for some or all of the listed Targeted Topic training topics. Applicants wishing to address more than one of the announced grant topics must submit a separate grant application for each topic.

▶ **Grant Name:** Centers for Independent Living--Training and Technical Assistance, CFDA # 84.132B

Funder: US Dept of Education/Office of Special Education and Rehabilitative Services (OSER)

Eligibility: Entities that have experience in the operation of centers for independent living.

Award Range/Funding Period: Priority 1--Centers for Independent Living (CILs) Training and Technical Assistance Center. Award cap is \$1,004,327. Priority 2--Statewide Independent Living Councils (SILCs) Training and Technical Assistance Center. Award cap is \$325,000. Project period is up to 60 months.

Summary: To provide training and technical assistance with respect to planning, developing, conducting, administering, and evaluating centers for independent living to the following entities: Centers for independent living (CILs), eligible agencies, and Statewide Independent Living Councils (SILCs). A CIL is a consumer-controlled, community-based, cross-disability, nonresidential private nonprofit agency that is designed and operated within a local community by individuals with disabilities and that provides an array of independent living services. An eligible agency is a consumer-controlled, community-based, cross-disability, nonresidential, private nonprofit agency. Each State establishes a SILC that jointly develops and signs the State Plan for Independent Living with the Designated State Unit and monitors, reviews, and evaluates the implementation of the State plan. A majority of a SILC's members are individuals with disabilities, and other members include CIL representatives and State agency representatives, as well as other appropriate individuals.

The purpose of independent living services is to maximize independence, productivity, empowerment, and leadership of individuals with significant disabilities and integrate these individuals into the mainstream of society.

Grant Name: Affordable Housing Built Responsibly

Funder: Home Depot Foundation

Eligibility: 501(c)(3) tax-exempt public charities in the United States

Award Range/Funding Period: Not specified.

Summary: Preference is given to proposals that include community engagement that result in the production, preservation, or financing of housing units for low- to moderate-income families that address as many of the following considerations as possible:

- resource efficiency in design, construction, and operations
- minimizes the depletion of natural resources, including timber and water
- designs and installs landscaping features such as trees and shrubs, that minimize demand for water and synthetic chemicals and reduce heat island effect
- reduces maintenance costs using innovative and durable materials
- uses more environmentally friendly building materials

- site planning with minimal environmental impact
- energy-efficiency and renewable energy use
- indoor air quality improvement, including moisture control and proper ventilation
- ensures smart site planning and land use

The Foundation's goals are to support education and research for the advancement of dental science and to promote the oral health of the public through education and service activities, particularly for those with special needs.
