Grant Name: Community Grant Program

Funder: Pepsico Foundation

Eligibility: The applicant must take an on-line eligibility quiz for each program area.

Award Range/Funding Period: Up to \$100,000; or over \$100,000

Summary: The Foundation's program interests lie in four areas: Health and Wellness, Diversity and Inclusion, Environment, and Thought Leadership.

Due Date: Rolling due date for requests under \$100,000, August 17 for requests over that amount.

Grant Name: Helping Outreach Programs to Expand, CFDA # 16.582

Funder: US DOJ/Office for Victims of Crime

Eligibility: Organizations and coalitions operating for at least 1 year that have not received federal Victims of Crime Act (VOCA) victim assistance grant funding and that have an annual operating budget of \$50,000 or less are eligible to apply. All applicants must also have a history of serving crime victims.

Award Range/Funding Period: Up to \$10,000 for one year.

Summary: This program supports grassroots community- and faith-based victim service organizations and coalitions to help them improve their outreach and services to crime victims, through support of program development, networking, coalition building, and service delivery. Funds may be used to develop program literature, train advocates, produce a newsletter, support victim outreach efforts, and recruit volunteers.

Grant Name: Grant Program

Funder: RGK Foundation

Eligibility: 501(c)(3) or 170(c) nonprofits

Award Range/Funding Period: Most awards are for

\$25,000 or less, for one year.

Summary: The Foundation's primary interests within **Education** include programs that focus on formal K-12 education (particularly mathematics, science and reading), teacher development, literacy, and higher education. Within **Community**, the Foundation supports a broad range of human services, community improvement, abuse prevention, and youth development programs. Human service programs of particular interest to the Foundation include children and family services, early childhood development, and parenting education. The Foundation supports a variety of Community Improvement programs including those that enhance non-profit management and promote philanthropy and voluntarism. Youth development programs supported by the Foundation typically include after-school educational enrichment programs that supplement and enhance formal education systems to increase the chances for successful outcomes in school and life. The Foundation is also interested in programs that attract female and minority students into the fields of mathematics, science, and technology. The Foundation's current interests in the area of **Medicine/Health** include programs that promote the health and well-being of children, programs that promote access to health services, and Foundation-initiated programs focusing on ALS.
