Grant Name: Edward Byrne Memorial Discretionary Grants Program, CFDA # 16.580

Funder: US Dept of Justice/Bureau of Justice Assistance

Eligibility: National, regional, state, or local public and private entities, including for-profit (commercial) and nonprofit organizations, faith and community-based organizations, institutions of higher education, tribal jurisdictions, and units of local government. Applicants for Category I

must represent multi-jurisdictional proposals from state, local, or tribal law enforcement agencies. (SEE WEBSITE FOR DESCRIPTIONS OF ALL 6 CATEGORIES)

Award Range/Funding Period: 12 month project period; only Category I funding levels are specified (see Page 3/Adobe Page 5 of website)

Summary: This program funds capacity-building for local justice systems under 6 categories: (1) Targeting Violent Crime; (2) Preventing Crime and Drug Abuse; (3) Enhancing Local Law Enforcement; (4) Enhancing Local Courts; (5) Enhancing Local Corrections and Offender Reentry; (6) Facilitating Justice Information Sharing.

Grant Name: Targeted Grants to Increase the Well-Being of, and to Improve the Permanency Outcomes

for, Children Affected by Methamphetamine or Other Substance Abuse, CFDA # 93.087

Funder: US Dept of HHS/ACF

Eligibility: State governments, county governments, local governments, city or township governments, regional organizations, independent school districts, public and state-controlled institutions of higher education, public housing authorities, non-profits with 501(c)(3) IRS status (other than institutions of higher education), non-profits without 501(c)(3) IRS status (other than institutions of higher education), private institutions of higher education, for-profit organizations (other than small businesses), small businesses, historically black colleges and universities (HBCUs), special district governments. Faith-based and community organizations that meet the statutory eligibility requirements are eligible to apply under this announcement.

Award Range/Funding Period: There are four Program Options: two possible Federal award amounts, \$500,000 or \$1,000,000 per budget period and two possible grant periods, three years or five years. Applicants should note that initial Federal awards at the \$1,000,000 level will decline between the second and third year of a three-year grant period and will decline between the second and fifth year of a five-year grant period, due to the overall decline in authorized Federal funds for this grant program over these grant periods. Federal awards at the \$500,000 level will remain fixed for the duration of either a three- or five-year grant period. Applicants must clearly state for which of these four program options they are applying.

Summary: These targeted grants will be awarded to regional partnerships that provide, through interagency collaboration and integration of programs and services, activities and services that are designed to increase the well-being of, improve permanency outcomes for, and enhance the safety of children who are in an out-of-home placement or are at risk of being placed in an out-of-home placement as a result of a parent's or caretaker's methamphetamine or other substance abuse.

Grant Name: Gang Prevention Coordination Assistance Program, CFDA # 16.544

Funder: US Dept of Justice/OJJDP

Eligibility: Public agencies (including state agencies, units of local government, public universities and colleges) and private organizations (including faith- and community-based organizations).

Award Range/Funding Period: Up to \$200,000 for a 24 month

project period.

Summary: This program provides funding for localities to enhance coordination of local, state, and federal resources in support of community partnerships implementing two or more of the following anti-gang strategies: primary prevention, secondary prevention, gang intervention, and gang enforcement.

Grant Name: Head Start Healthy Marriage Initiative Project Grants, CFDA # 93.600

Funder: US Dept of HHS/ACF

Eligibility: Head Start and Early

Head Start grantees, in partnership with other community organizations and agencies that have demonstrated successful experience with delivering skills-based marriage education services (a Head Start grantee must be the fiscal agent).

Award Range/Funding Period: Up to \$500,000 per budget period, with project periods up to 60 months. There is a 20% match.

Summary: These grants will provide Head Start and Early Head Start grantees with funding to offer marriage education services to their current service population, as well as Head Start eligible families in their service areas. Grants will extend access to voluntary marriage education services to low-income individuals who would not otherwise have these services available. It will provide an opportunity for Head Start and Early Head Start grantees to partner with other organizations in their communities to offer a full range of practical skill-building sessions on communication, joint decision making, parenting, managing of family budgets, conflict resolution, and other elements to enhance family stabilization. The target audience for services is fragile families, including low-income families, single parents, teenage parents, unwed and/or new or expectant parents. Services may be offered to those contemplating marriage and to couples wishing to strengthen their relationships. In addition, services that focus on the teaching of communication skills, problem solving, and conflict resolution skills may be offered to adolescent siblings of Head Start eligible children in the context of healthy dating and peer relationships with application to marriage later in life.
