Grant Name: Food Stamp Outreach Grant Competition, CFDA # 10.580

Funder: US Dept of Agriculture, Food and Nutrition Service

Eligibility: Entities eligible for these outreach grants are private non-profit organizations, including community and faith-based organizations, and public entities with the exception

of State and local FSP agencies. Past recipients of an FNS Outreach or Participation Grant are not eligible.

Award Range/Funding Period: The maximum grant award is \$75,000, for a project period not to exceed two years.

Summary: The purpose of the FY 2008 grant is to implement and learn more about effective strategies to inform and educate potentially eligible low income seniors and Hispanic persons, who are not currently participating in the Food Stamp Program (FSP), about the nutrition benefits of the program, eligibility rules, and how to apply. There are three proposal models, one for seniors, one for Hispanics, and one for senior Hispanics over 60.

Grant Name: Bowerman Track Renovation Program

Funder: Nike Corporate

Eligibility: U.S. applicants should be exempt from income taxes under Section 501(c)(3) or 509(a) of the Internal Revenue Code and be defined as a public charity or a unit of government. Athletic booster clubs, schools and school districts are considered public charities and are eligible to apply.

Award Range/Funding Period: Matching funds of up to \$50,000 are provided.

Summary: The Bowerman Track Renovation Program provides matching cash grants to community-based, youth-oriented organizations that seek to refurbish or construct running tracks. In order to be eligible for the program, organizations submitting applications must:

- Be a community-based, nonprofit or nongovernmental organization (NGO) organization serving youth;
- Employ at least one full-time staff person;
- Maintain a viable track program serving boys and girls, ages 14-18;
- Consider Nike Grind as the material used for track refurbishment or construction (see Nike Grind section for more information);
- Demonstrate that the track is available in all or most weather conditions and open to and used by members of the community for organized meets and other events;
- Provide evidence of or an ability to secure matching funds from other organizations by an agreed upon deadline for the completion of track refurbishment or construction;
- Accommodate a site visit by Nike representatives if necessary;
- Mount at the track, at Nike's expense, a plaque commemorating Bill Bowerman;
- Demonstrate a solid commitment to quality construction standards, track maintenance and safety; and
- Indemnify and hold harmless Nike, Inc., its vendors and partners.

Grant Name: The Purpose Prize

Funder: Civic Ventures

Eligibility: Citizens over 60.

Award Range/Funding Period: The Purpose

Prize™ provides five awards of \$100,000 and ten awards of \$10,000 to people over 60 who are taking on society's biggest challenges.

Summary: The Purpose Prize™ is a prestigious new award given to five exceptional individuals over age 60 who are defying societal expectations by channeling their creativity and talent to address critical social problems at the local, regional, or national level. An additional 15 finalists and 55 Purpose Prize fellows will receive national recognition for their work. These pioneers are action-oriented and effective innovators who have initiated important innovations (in a new or ongoing organization) in the past several years, demonstrating creativity and leadership throughout and promising more to come. They may be working in nonprofits, government, or for-profit organizations. Some may be social

entrepreneurs who have started new organizations; others may be change-makers whose innovative approaches to leadership have transformed existing organizations, or as grassroots activists playing a leadership role in improving communities or advancing a cause.

Grant Name: CATCH Implementation Funds Program

Funder: American Academy of Pediatrics

Eligibility: Members of the AAP; a

pediatrician must also lead the project.

Award Range/Funding Period: \$12,000

Summary: These grants should lead to the initialization of implementation projects aimed at increasing access to medical homes and other needed services. There are two opportunities in this announcement. The second one is called the “Secondhand Smoke Exposure Reduction” grant, for pediatricians interested in developing projects focused on reducing secondhand tobacco smoke (SHS) exposure for children and youth.
