Discretionary Grants for the Family
Violence Prevention and Services

Program, CFDA # 93.592

Funder: US Dept of HHS/ACF

Eligibility: Public and State-controlled institutions of higher education, non-profits with 501(c)(3) IRS status (other than institutions of higher education), non-profits without 501(c)(3) IRS status (other than institutions of higher education), private institutions of higher education, Hispanic-serving institutions, HBCUs, public or private non-profit educational institutions that have domestic violence institutes, centers or programs related to culturally-specific issues in domestic violence; and, private non-profit organizations and/or collaborations that focus primarily on issues of domestic violence in racial and ethnic underserved communities. All applicants must have documented experience in the areas of domestic violence prevention and services, and experience of relevance to the specific underserved populations to whom assistance, outreach, information, and technical support would be provided. Each applicant must have an advisory board/steering committee that is reflective of the targeted underserved community. Faith-based and community organizations that meet the statutory eligibility requirements are eligible to apply under this announcement.

Award Range/Funding Period: \$425,000 per annual budget period, with a project period of 3 years.

Summary: The goal of the programs and activities supported by these funds is to improve

the capacity of domestic violence programs to offer services that are culturally relevant, and accessible to victims with complex needs. Some examples of projects and activities that may be funded include, but are not limited to, training on culturally sensitive practices to prevent and respond to domestic violence in culturally-specific communities, program self-assessment to identify and develop plans to address service barriers, and training and technical assistance to develop domestic violence program capacity to serve victims of domestic violence with multiple challenges.

Grant Name: Weed and Seed Communities Competitive Program, CFDA # 16.595

Funder: US DOJ/CCDO

Eligibility: Eligible entities include state, local or tribal governments or nonprofit organizations in communities with a persistent high level of serious violent crime (Part I) pursuant to this guide, which have not previously been an approved Weed and Seed site. Under certain circumstances, a newly proposed Weed and Seed community may include portions of prior Weed and Seed sites, provided they submit justification that meets the criteria outlined in the appendix entitled "Overlapping Boundaries" at

Award Range/Funding Period: Up to \$1MM over a five-year eligibility period.

Summary: The Weed and Seed strategy aims to prevent, control, and reduce violent crime, criminal drug-related activity, and gang activity. The Weed and Seed strategy is a community-based, comprehensive multi-agency approach. Four elements make up the two-pronged Weed and Seed Strategy: Law Enforcement; Community Policing; Prevention, Intervention, and Treatment; and Neighborhood Restoration.
