Grant Name: Latino Youth Mentoring Program, CFDA # 16.726

Funder: US DOJ/OJJDP

Eligibility: OJJDP invites applications from private organizations, nonprofits (including faith and community based organizations), and public agencies (including schools, colleges, universities, and units of local government).

Award Range/Funding Period: Up to 4 awards of up to \$500,000

each will be made to support this 3-year project.

Summary: The goals of the program are to: 1) prevent gang participation and violence by at-risk Latino youth by offering them an alternative that fulfills their developmental adolescent needs and leaves no desire for gang affiliation and 2) reduce or prevent delinquency, violence, dropping out of school, and truancy. OJJDP seeks applicants to establish a school-based peer mentoring program (a mentoring club) for high school youth. Mentors are adolescents already acclimated to high school and the surrounding community, who serve as peer mentors to new students and incoming ninth graders. Identified by school staff, these incoming students are recruited to join this afterschool program. Successful applicants will include local school districts with a demonstrable Latino gang problem committed to or already working with nonprofits, faith-based organizations, and other community partners to provide mentoring services to at-risk youth. Targeted programs will feature schools with large populations of non-native, Hispanic youth.

Grant Name: Discretionary Grants for the Family Violence Prevention and Services Program, CFDA # 93.592

Funder: US Dept of HHS/ ACF

Eligibility: Public and State-controlled institutions of higher education, non-profits with 501(c)(3) IRS status (other than institutions of higher education), non-profits without 501(c)(3) IRS status (other than institutions of higher education), private institutions of higher education, Hispanic-Serving Institutions, Historically Black Colleges and Universities (HBCUs), Alaska Native and Native Hawaiian Serving Institutions, public or private non-profit educational institutions that have domestic violence institutes, centers or programs related to culturally-specific issues in domestic violence; and, private non-profit organizations and/or collaborations that focus primarily on issues of domestic violence in racial and ethnic underserved communities. All applicants must have documented experience in the areas of domestic violence prevention and services, and experience of relevance to the specific underserved populations to whom assistance, outreach, information, and technical support would be provided. Each applicant must have an advisory board/steering committee that is reflective of the targeted underserved community.

Award Range/Funding Period: \$425,000 per budget period for 3 12-mo. budget periods.

Summary: The goal of the programs and activities supported by these funds is to improve the capacity of domestic violence programs to offer services that are culturally relevant, and accessible to victims with complex needs. Some examples of projects and activities that may be funded include, but are not limited to, training on culturally sensitive practices to prevent and respond to domestic violence in culturally-specific communities, program self-assessment to identify and develop plans to address service barriers, and training and technical assistance to develop domestic violence program capacity to serve victims of domestic violence with multiple challenges.

Grant Name: Street Outreach Program, CFDA # 93.557

Funder: US Dept of HHS/ACF

Eligibility: Non-profits with 501(c)(3) IRS status (other than institutions of higher education); non-profits without 501(c)(3) IRS status (other than institutions of higher education).

Award Range/Funding Period: \$200,000 per budget period for a project period of 3 years (3 budget periods).

Summary: The Street Outreach Program's purpose is to conduct outreach services designed to build relationships between grantee staff and street youth. A range of education, intervention, and prevention services are offered to youth who are at risk of being subjected

to sexual abuse or exploitation. The goal of these efforts is to help young people leave the streets and assist in moving and adjusting to a safe and appropriate living arrangement.

Grant Name: Tax Counseling for the Elderly

Funder: US Dept of the Treasury/IRS

Eligibility: To be eligible to participate in the program you must: a) be a private or public non-profit organization that qualifies for tax exemption under Section 501 of the Internal

Revenue Code of 1986; b) have experience in coordinating volunteer programs; c) not be a federal, state, or local governmental agency or organization.

Award Range/Funding Period: Not specified.

Summary: The Tax Counseling for the Elderly (TCE) Program offers FREE Federal tax assistance to individuals who are age 60 or older. Grant funds are used to reimburse volunteers for out-of-pocket expenses including transportation, meals, and other expenses incurred by them in providing tax counseling assistance at locations convenient to the taxpayers.
