Grant Name: Ohio Fatherhood Initiative

Funder: Governor's Office of Faith-Based and Community Initiatives

Eligibility: 501(c)(3) organizations with at least 2 years' experience serving families and children, and whose proposals involve operational partnerships.

Award Range/Funding Period: \$150,000 - \$450,000, project term ends 6-30-09.

Summary: The programs selected through this competitive process must demonstrate innovative and effective approaches to 1.) serving fathers from low-income backgrounds working to develop strong and healthy relationships with their children and to become responsible caregivers, as well as, 2.) preventing premature fatherhood. GOFBCI is seeking non-profit applicants with a minimum of two years' experience serving families and children, with a preferred emphasis on fatherhood specific programming.

Grant Name: Training and Information for Parents of Children with Disabilities, CFDA # 84.328C.

Funder: US Dept of Education

Eligibility: Local parent organizations.

Award Range/Funding Period: \$100,000 per year for 36 months.

Summary: This priority supports community parent resource centers (CPRCs) in targeted communities that will provide underserved parents of children with disabilities, including low-income parents, parents of limited English proficient children, and parents with disabilities in that community, with the training and information they need to enable them to participate cooperatively and effectively in helping their children with disabilities to--

(a) Meet developmental and functional goals, and challenging academic achievement goals that have been established for all children; and

(b) Be prepared to lead productive, independent adult lives, to the maximum extent possible.

Grant Name: Technical Assistance and Dissemination To Improve Services and Results for Children With Disabilities, CFDA # 84.326C

Funder: US Dept of Education

Eligibility: A state may be served by only one supported project, conducted by SEAs; LEAs, including public charter schools that are considered LEAs under State law; IHEs; other public agencies; private nonprofit organizations; outlying areas; FAS; Indian tribes or tribal organizations; and for-profit organizations.

Award Range/Funding Period: The funding level for Ohio is \$259,320 for a 12-month budget period.

Summary: The purpose of this program is to promote academic achievement and to improve results for children with disabilities by providing technical assistance (TA), supporting model demonstration projects, disseminating useful information, and implementing activities that are supported by scientifically based research.
